MINUTES

Temecula-Elsinore-Anza-Murrieta Resource Conservation District Regular Board Meeting Thursday, February 13, 2025, at 4:00 PM

I. PRELIMINARY FUNCTIONS

<u>Call to Order</u> – 4:00 p.m. Meeting recorded by Zoom.

Roll Call/Establish a Quorum Directors Present: Teri Biancardi, President; Pablo Bryant, Vice President; Rose Corona, Director; Stuart Kuhn, Director. Directors Absent: Newt Parkes, Secretary Appearing via Zoom: Rae Shirer, Office Manager; Kit Swift, Conservation Tech; Keir Thomas (NRCS); James Law (SAWA). Public Guests: via Zoom—Ross Yamaguchi, Stephanie Moreno, Breanna Smith (Riverside County Board of Supervisors, for the Clerk of the Board)

<u>Oath of Office for Director Teri Biancardi</u>- Director Biancardi was sworn in by Clerk of the Board Executive Assistant Breanna Smith for a full term ending November 30, 2028.

<u>Approval of Agenda</u> – Director Bryant moved, and Director Kuhn seconded, to approve the Agenda unanimously. Upon voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved approved.

<u>Public comment</u> – Ross Yamaguchi, Director at Highpoint Communities. Highpoint's environmental consultant was reaching out regarding a possible project in Temecula, working with IERCD, CDFW on a mitigation site. Wishes to open discussion with TEAM RCD regarding the project. Will provide all materials and information for discussion. President Biancardi stated that she would get in touch with the parties involved in the week following this board meeting.

II. <u>CONSENT CALENDAR:</u>

Director Corona asked that items 2 and 6 be pulled from the consent calendar, as the Minutes of the January 23, 2025 Special Meeting were not in the directors' packet and no additional information had been received regarding the Soil and Water Hub Agreement.

Director Bryant moved, and Director Kuhn seconded to:

- 1. Approve Minutes of the Board of Directors Regular Meeting of January 9, 2025.
- 2. Approve for current bills and reimbursements:
 - a) Bills paid
 - b) Bills to be paid or reimbursement
 - c) Accounts Receivable

Draft – for discussion purposes only

- 3. Approve monthly financial reports for periods ending December 31, 2024.
- 4. Approve monthly financial reports for periods ending January 31, 2025

Upon voice vote, the motion carried unanimously.

Following the vote, Director Corona clarified that she had meant to pull the January 9, 2025, minutes and requested a change to those minutes to include additional detail regarding what was said during the meeting. Upon discussion and reconsideration by the board, Director Kuhn moved, and Director Bryant seconded, that a new vote be taken to approve the January 9, 2025, minutes. Upon roll call vote, the minutes were approved.

III. DISCUSSION

A. Subject: TEAM RCD Financial Standing

Keir Thomas (NRCS) presented a discussion of President Trump's January 20, 2025, Executive Order freezing grant funding and its effect on the TEAM RCD cooperative agreement with NRCS. NRCS programs will be reviewed by the incoming Secretary of Agriculture. Following board discussion, Manager Shirer agreed to submit invoices to NRCS on a monthly basis so that when the funding uncertainty is resolved, the paperwork will already be NRCS hands.

President Biancardi noted that TEAM RCD available funds to cover NRCS costs, including the Conservation Tech costs, through the end of the fiscal year. Manager Shirer stated there is currently approximately \$150,000 in unallocated funds and that TEAM RCD is expected to receive an additional \$150,000 from Riverside County Flood Control before the end of the fiscal year.

IV. ACTION ITEMS:

<u>B. Subject</u>: Community Wildfire Defense Grant (CDFG)

Background: CDFG grants provide funding for the development of Community Wildfire Protection Plans. The Inland Empire Community Foundation is offering support to TEAMRCD and SJBRCD to submit a grant application for funding to develop CWPPs in the Anza and Idlywild areas. The deadline is February 28th.

David Hernandez of IECF and James Law of the Santa Ana Watershed Association presented details regarding the grant application process. TEAM RCD would not be a grant applicant. Inland Empire Community Foundation would apply. If the grant is

approved, IECF would then turn to RCDs such as TEAM to implement the work approved for funding. TEAM would invoice IECF, which would pay from grant funds.

Following discussion, Director Kuhn moved, and Director Bryant seconded, that TEAM RCD move forward with the project. Director Corona proposed a substitute motion to approve participation subject to seeing the draft grant application and budget. Lacking a second, the substitute motion failed. The original motion was then restated.

Upon roll call vote, the board authorized Inland Empire Community Foundation to name TEAM RCD as a cooperating agency in a Community Wildfire Defense Grant application to be submitted by February 28, 2025.

<u>C. Subject:</u> Social Media policy

Background: One of the areas identified in the Strategic Planning session as a goal was to utilize social media effectively. The board is asked to review the existing social media policy as well as review a more detailed proposal which addresses when, where and how social media is used. The board may wish to discuss amendments to the existing social media policy and designate individuals responsible for posting.

TEAM RCD Conservation Tech Kit Swift discussed the proposal he had prepared for creating a social media presence. Following discussion, Director Bryant moved, and Director Kuhn seconded, that Kit Swift be authorized to proceed with implementation of the proposal and that Kit Swift be the interim "social media manager" with the board revisiting the social media planning and implementation in 30 days. Upon a roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously.

<u>D. Subject</u>: Document retention schedule and handbook update.

Background: Office Manager Rae Shirer has been reviewing and sorting all District documents and designing a data retention system that will comply with Riverside County's standards. She is also updating the policy manual in coordination with the retention schedule which are correlated.

Manager Shirer reported that she had not made significant progress, as the onboarding of the new employee had taken up more of her time than expected.

DIRECTORS' REPORTS

• Teri Biancardi: Reported that there was little to report from SAWA. She proposed that another Community Wildfire Resilience Special Meeting be set for late March and will move forward with that scheduling. President Biancardi also noted that Kit Swift had

been working on a report covering numerous topics regarding the district, such as acreage under cultivation, number of farmers, fire resources, etc. A list of proposed topics was included in the directors' packet and President Biancardi requested that the directors review it before discussion at a future meeting.

Finally, President Biancardi reported that she had received a "cure and correct" letter from Rose Corona that would require a special meeting. All directors were asked if their calendars were clear and President Biancardi stated she would go forward with a special meeting on February 21, 2025, at 10:00 a.m., at the Truax Building.

- Stuart Kuhn: Mitigation report—Director Kuhn reported on conversations that had taken place regarding the Highpoint Communities mitigation project that Ross Yamaguchi has addressed during the public comment period. Specifically, the question is whether TEAM RCD has the capacity to take on the easement and longterm maintenance and management of 30 acre parcel in the Temecula area. The developer feels the matter is urgent and is holding up the development. There was general discussion by the board of discussing the project at a special meeting.
- Pablo Bryant: Watershed clean-up—Director Bryant reported that he has received a funding pledge from Riverside Flood Control of \$5,000. He is now planning for a date in April, that would compliment Earth Day activities.
- Rose Corona: CARCD policy committee updates—Director Corona reported that there was no quorum at the policy committee meeting, so no action was taken.

V. MANAGEMENT REPORT

Rae Shirer reported on the onboarding process for Kit Swift, procedures for payroll and amounts spent to date.

I. PRELIMINARY FUNCTIONS

<u>Call to Order</u> – 10:00 a.m. Meeting recorded by Microsoft Teams.

Roll Call/Establish a Quorum

<u>Approval of Agenda</u> – Director Bryant moved, and Director Parkes seconded, to approve the Agenda. Director Corona objected, on the grounds that meeting materials were not provided for the board and public. Specifically, Director Corona stated that a copy of the "cure and correct" letter should have been included as well as a copy of the mitigation policy under consideration.

Upon roll call vote, the Agenda was approved:

During the roll call, Director Corona stated, for the record, that she believed that this Special Meeting was held in violation of the Brown Act.

<u>Public Comment:</u> Ms. Sarmiento stated: "The public needed to receive the cure and correct letter. It is relevant information in order to move on with any further voting. It apprises them of information and it is a violation of the Brown Act under government code section 54954.2. Until my clients, members of the public, are able to receive this information, they can't be apprised in making an informed decision as far as sharing what they have to share with the board. I would like that to be addressed in the meeting minutes. Thank you."

II. ACTION ITEMS

A. Subject: Brown Act Cure and Correct Demand

Draft for Discussion Only

Background: Director Rose Corona has demanded a Cure and Correction of the CARCD vote taken in the January regular board meeting.

On January 9, 2025, the board of directors of TEAM RCD met for its regular monthly meeting. At that time, the board voted for the Socal Region Chair and Vice-Chair, with each director completing a written ballot.

The results of the vote were announced on the record, but individual votes of the directors were not made public.

The board discussed the appropriate method to cure and correct the error, with Director Corona contending that the January 9, 2025 needed to be officially declared "void" by the board. Director Corona again contended that this Special Meeting was in violation of the Brown Act for failure to include a copy of the cure and correct demand in the meeting materials.

President Biancardi telephoned county counsel Braden Holly for legal advice. He found no requirement in the statutes that the demand be included with the meeting agenda materials.

During this discussion, President Biancardi asked Director Corona why she did not come forward with her concerns regarding the January 9, 2025, vote earlier. Director Corona stated she did not realize it until she was informed by her private legal counsel who she had asked for assistance in resolving a tie vote in the Socal Region election.

President Biancardi then stated: "I see. What I come away from this experience with is that you in your legal efforts to threaten and harass us, and the subsequent part where our vote is nullified is there's no legal, there's no statute associated with that. That's just your supposition that you're making. It's suppressing your own district's voice, so that to me is really intolerable, and something that I think that we should all take a look at.

Our own district did not endorse your running and dragging us into this fight with CARCD. In terms of your fiduciary duty to this district, this whole-- You once again going to private counsel and spending your money to thwart our objectives is a reflection of your dedication to our district. I just want that to go on the record as well."

Following this discussion, the board proceeded to retake the vote for the Socal Region Chair and Vice-Chair, correcting the record of the January 9, 2025 vote.

POLICY: MITIGATION PROJECTS

The Temecula Elsinore Anza Murrieta Resource Conservation District ("District") has the authority to perform services for the control of runoff, the prevention or control of soil erosion, the development and distribution of water, and the improvement of land capabilities. (Public Resources Code § 9151.) In connection with providing such services, the District also has the following powers:

- 1. The District may accept gifts and grants of money from any source whatsoever to carry out the purposes of the District. (Public Resources Code § 9403.);
- The District may acquire by gift all lands and property, including conservation easements, necessary to carry out the plans and works of the District. (Public Resources Code § 9405.);
- When acquiring a conservation easement, the District is to prepare or have prepared a management plan and/or other legal documents for the easement which fully describe the intent and legal obligations respecting the easement. (Public Resources Code § 9405.);
- 4. The District may take conveyances, leases, contracts, or other assurances for all property acquired by the District, in the name, and for the uses and purposes of, the District. (Public Resources Code § 9406.);
- 5. The District may execute all necessary contracts, and may employ such agents, officers, and employees as may be necessary, and prescribe their duties. (Public Resources Code § 9404.)

The District desires to delegate to the District Manager and/or the President the authority to engage in mitigation projects of a certain size and within a certain dollar amount, pursuant to the requirements and limitations set forth herein.

Policies and Procedures

- A. The District Manager, President, or his/her designee, shall have the authority to approve the District's participation in certain mitigation projects ("Mitigation Projects") pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth herein.
- B. The District Manager or President may approve the District's participation in Mitigation Projects, which consist of, or are accompanied by, a total monetary commitment, funding, endowment, projected expenditures with a firm commitment for payment, or other associated financial arrangements, present or future, which equal Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) or less for each

Mitigation Project. The determination of said financial commitment shall not include the value of any property interest conveyed or otherwise transferred to the District in connection with said Mitigation Project,

- **C.** The District's goal is to participate in habitat mitigation projects with developers and others that are triggered by the United States Fish & Wildlife Service, United States Army Corps of Engineers, California Department of Fish & Wildlife, Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board and permits issued by other regulatory agencies. The District will duly consider the reporting requirements of each of these agencies in determining the costs of managing mitigation and conservation lands.
- D. The developer or project proponent will be required to provide the District with copies of all relevant permits issued by the regulatory agency or agencies, a Habitat Mitigation and Monitoring Plan (HMMP), any other relevant documentation, and the deposit set forth below before an estimate of the cost of accepting the conservation easement or other property interest, and/or the cost of services, is provided.
- E. The developer or project proponent shall provide the District with a draft copy of any Covenants, Conditions & Restrictions ("CC&Rs") for the Project. The District shall review such CC&Rs for the purpose of ensuring they contain adequate provisions related to any onsite easement area and other relevant matters. The District may require that changes or additions be made to CC&Rs to address District concerns.
- F. Before a conservation easement is accepted, the developer or project proponent shall pay for and provide the District with: (a) a Phase I environmental report covering the subject property that is less than six months old, or an updated report that is less than one year old; (b) an appraisal valuing the proposed conservation easement interest in the property; (c) a copy of the project's fuel modification plan; (d) a current title report; (e) any and all relevant correspondence and reports/documentation between the project proponent, developer, or consultants, and the regulatory agencies; (f) a map of the project and proposed conservation area; (g) an aerial photo of the area; (h) any relevant documentation related to any project homeowners or similar association.
- **G.** The District may require the developer or project proponent to provide irrigation lines and water to the conservation area, at no cost to the District.
- H. No fuel modification zones may be located on the conservation easement or property to be accepted by the District. Instead, any such required fuel modification zones must be located on the portion of the project site not set aside for conservation.

- I. All costs associated with habitat mitigation will be site specific and included in the fee or endowment agreed to by the District and the developer or project proponent. Among other considerations, the endowment shall:
 - Include a reasonable factor for inflation ("Inflation Factor"). The Board may review and adjust the appropriateness of the Inflation Factor as necessary.
 - Be calculated using a reasonable rate of return for investments held by public agencies ("Rate of Return"). The Board may review and adjust the appropriateness of the Rate of Return as necessary.
 - Include annual expenses to enhance native plant communities, including removing non-native species and other types of weed control and planting trees and shrubs of the same type as currently existing on the Mitigation Project site or other appropriate native species.
 - In addition to a Maintenance and Monitoring Endowment, all Conservation Easements accepted by the RCD shall be accompanied by a Legal Enforcement Endowment except in extraordinary circumstances as determined by the Board. Considerations that staff may take into account to calculate the Legal Enforcement Endowment include the size of the Conservation Easement Area, the number of residences on the edge of the Conservation Easement Area, the number of 13 residences in the Homeowner's Association, the major roads and highways in proximity to the Conservation Easement Area, whether the Conservation Easement Area is located in an urban or rural setting, and other issues. As a starting target, the Legal Enforcement Endowment should ordinarily be at least 20% of the Maintenance and Monitoring Endowment.
 - The minimum mitigation project fees for oak woodland, riparian and upland habitats will be determined by the habitat type and will be set annually by the District Board of Directors. It is expected that minimum fees will vary between District and non-District lands. The minimum fee to be charged by the District will be for .25 acre, regardless if the particular conservation area is less than that size.
 - Generally, the District will not accept conservation easements or other property interests over lands where third parties, such as Homeowners' Associations, are given or retain significant management responsibilities over the conservation property. For example, the District will generally not accept an easement where a Homeowners Association retains the right or duty to weed, to remove trash or to enter the conservation easement area at its discretion. Based upon its experience, the District believes such arrangements are likely, over time, to detract from the conservation values of the property.

- The District may enter into agreements with public agencies, organizations, and others, wherein the District provides services for compensation.
- Ordinarily, the District will not accept trail easements, nor will the District accept a conservation easement that contains a trail.
- **J.** A report detailing all Mitigation Projects approved by the District Manager or President during the prior quarter shall be prepared and presented to the Board for its review on a quarterly basis at a regularly scheduled Board meeting.
- **K.** The District will generally not accept conservation easements or other property interests, nor maintenance nor operational responsibilities, over detention basins, flood control facilities, or similar structures.
- L. Violation Mitigation Awards will generally be deposited to the District's short-term mitigation account and be used for District mitigation lands.
- M. Deposit Agreement Fees are as follows:
 - Projects with expected mitigation, endowment or others costs under \$100,000 will require a \$20,000 deposit.
 - Projects with expected mitigation, endowment or others costs over \$100,000 will require a \$25,000 deposit.
 - Projects with expected mitigation, endowment or others costs over \$1,000,000 will require a \$35,000 deposit
- N. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth herein, nothing in this Policy shall be deemed to restrict, or otherwise limit, the power and authority of the Board of Directors or the District Manager to perform any services, or any other activities, authorized under California law

DEPOSIT AGREEMENT FOR EXPENSES INCURRED DURING NEGOTIATION

This Deposit Agreement ("Deposit Agreement") for expenses incurred during negotiation, preparation, and review of a document to convey a real property interest to the Southwest Resource Management Association, a California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation ("TEAMRCD"), and [DEVELOPER] or [LANDOWNER], a [DESCRIBE DEVELOPER'S BUSINESS ENTITY, i.e. LLP, INC., etc.] ("Developer") as of the date set forth below. TEAMRCD and Developer may hereinafter be referred to as the "Parties."

1. <u>TEAMRCD</u>.

The Temecula Elsinore Anza Murrieta Resource Conservation District ("District") has the authority to perform services for the control of runoff, the prevention or control of soil erosion, the development and distribution of water, and the improvement of land capabilities. (Public Resources Code § 9151.) In connection with providing such services, the District also has the following powers:

1. The District may accept gifts and grants of money from any source whatsoever to carry out the purposes of the District. (Public Resources Code § 9403.);

2. The District may acquire by gift all lands and property, including conservation easements, necessary to carry out the plans and works of the District. (Public Resources Code § 9405.);

3. When acquiring a conservation easement, the District is to prepare or have prepared a management plan and/or other legal documents for the easement which fully describe the intent and legal obligations respecting the easement. (Public Resources Code § 9405.);

4. The District may take conveyances, leases, contracts, or other assurances for all property acquired by the District, in the name, and for the uses and purposes of, the District. (Public Resources Code § 9406.);

5. The District may execute all necessary contracts, and may employ such agents, officers, and employees as may be necessary, and prescribe their duties. (Public Resources Code § 9404.)

2. <u>Developer</u>.

[DESCRIBE DEVELOPER OR LANDOWNER AND PROJECT]

3. <u>Purpose</u>

A proposed development project may adversely impact a species, habitat, riparian areas, or other sensitive environmental resources. As a condition to issuing a permit required for such project, a regulatory agency may require mitigation in the form of land set-aside, restoration or other activity. Regulatory agencies may approve the project proponent's retention of TEAMRCD to perform habitat conservation, acceptance of a conservation easement, or other activity as mitigation of project impacts. Any such conservation to be performed by TEAMRCD would be completed under the terms of a separate conservation agreement with TEAMRCD.

In negotiating and preparing the conveyance document(s) and any other mitigationrelated contracts, agreements, or other documents between TEAMRCD and the project proponents, TEAMRCD incurs expenses including, but not limited to, legal expenses, administrative and staff expenses, materials, labor, etc. ("Expenses"). If the proposed conveyance goes forward, or if it is cancelled, abandoned, modified, disapproved or otherwise does not proceed for any reason, then TEAMRCD will have incurred Expenses.

By this Deposit Agreement, TEAMRCD requests, and Developer agrees to provide, a deposit to TEAMRCD to cover and fully defray the Expenses.

4. <u>Deposit</u>.

(a) The Parties agree that FIFTEEN THOUSAND AND NO/100'S DOLLARS (**\$15,000**) is a reasonable amount calculated to cover the anticipated Expenses incurred related to the execution of the document(s) and/or other agreements with respect to the proposed conveyance ("Deposit"). If TEAMRCD determines that its incurred costs will exceed the Deposit amount, TEAMRCD shall notify Developer in writing, and may request additional Deposit monies before proceeding further with the potential conveyance.

(b) In the event that the Parties successfully execute and record any conveyance documents or other, similar type of agreement with respect to the Developer's property, TEAMRCD shall deduct from the Deposit all Expenses related to the negotiation and preparation of the various contracts, agreements, and/or other documents relating to the conveyance or other agreements; any remaining portion of the Deposit shall be returned to Developer.

(c) In the event that the Parties do not successfully execute and record a conveyance document or other, similar type of agreement with respect to the Developer's property, TEAMRCD shall deduct its Expenses from the Deposit and return any remaining portion to Developer as in Paragraph 4(b), above. Developer may cancel this conveyance; receive a refund of the remaining Deposit and an accounting of Expenses. To obtain this refund and accounting, Developer must send to TEAMRCD, by certified mail, a written notice of cancellation, requesting an accounting and a refund of any remaining Deposit monies. TEAMRCD shall perform such accounting and refund any remaining Deposit monies within 30 days of its receipt of the cancellation notice and request.

5. <u>Anticipated Mitigation (if applicable)</u>

The Parties expect any anticipated mitigation to be the normal and ordinary conservation TEAMRCD commonly performs; however, it is not yet known what the regulatory agencies will actually require. 6. <u>Nature of Rights Granted</u>

Developer hereby acknowledges and agrees this Deposit Agreement only provides a deposit to cover or defray Expenses TEAMRCD will incur in the negotiation and preparation of the various contracts, agreements, and/or other documents relating to potentially accepting a conveyance of the property required by the Developer. This Deposit Agreement is not a donation agreement nor a real property conveyance document, nor does this Deposit Agreement guarantee that the Parties will eventually consummate such an easement or agreement. No form of representation or statement to any party shall be made which would constitute an express or implied endorsement of the project by the TEAMRCD or of any relationship between the parties, nor shall authorization be provided for others to do so, without first having obtained written approval from TEAMRCD.

8. <u>Mitigation Responsibility</u>

The Parties explicitly agree that this Deposit Agreement does not commit TEAMRCD to actually performing any mitigation, mitigation-related conservation, or related activity. Moreover, it is expressly understood and agreed by the Parties that this Agreement is to enable the TEAMRCD to make certain determinations regarding the potential project and does not obligate the TEAMRCD to engage in any mitigation. No responsibility or liability therefor shall accrue to the TEAMRCD. If the TEAMRCD ever conducts any mitigation on the Property at Developer's request, the TEAMRCD will make no warranties or representations and cannot guarantee that the TEAMRCD will be able to provide any particular mitigation that may be required of the Developer by any regulatory agency, including but not limited to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, or the State or Regional Water Quality Control Boards. Developer agrees that any requests for TEAMRCD to perform any mitigation, mitigation-related conservation, or related activity, including associated reporting for such activities, may cost extra and is not covered by this Deposit Agreement.

(a) Neither Party may assign its rights or obligations under this Deposit Agreement without the express written consent of the other, and both Parties agree not to unreasonably withhold such consent. (b) The rights and obligations set forth herein are intended exclusively for the benefit of the Parties and shall not be construed to convey any rights or remedies to any third party.

(c) This Deposit Agreement contains the entire understanding between the Parties with respect to its subject matter, and supersedes all prior agreements, oral or written, and all prior or contemporaneous discussions or negotiations between the Parties. This Deposit Agreement cannot be amended except in writing signed by both Parties.



As you may be aware, the Riverside Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) is mandated by the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (CKH) to prepare Municipal Service Reviews (MSRs) on cities and special districts in conjunction with Sphere of Influence (SOI) updates once every five years or as necessary. The MSRs are intended to be a comprehensive review of the municipal services provided by affected agencies. Upon completion of a municipal service review, the Commission must make determinations with respect to several factors, including:

- (1) Growth and population projections for the affected area;
- (2) The location and characteristics of any disadvantaged unincorporated communities (DUCs) within or contiguous to the sphere;
- (3) Present and planned capacity of public facilities and adequacy of public services;
- (4) Financial ability of agencies to provide services;
- (5) Status of, and opportunities for, shared facilities;
- (6) Accountability for service needs, including governmental structure or operational efficiencies.
- (7) Any other matter related to the effective or efficient service delivery, as required by Commission policy.

In conjunction with the MSR, LAFCO is also required to review each agency's present and probable sphere of influence (SOI). An SOI identifies the probable future boundaries and service areas of all cities and special districts. Public agencies can use SOIs as a tool to conduct service and facility planning for areas it intends to serve. SOIs also serve the public as an indicator of an agency's growth plans.

Our staff is currently undertaking an MSR to review all independent special districts that provide resource conservation services within the County. Within the coming weeks we will be sending out a questionnaire requesting information on services provided by your district and other

related matters. We are requesting your assistance in designating a single point of contact that will be responsible for coordinating responses from the district. Please provide that contact information to the email listed below. We ask that you communicate with your staff that responding to the information request is both necessary and important. The MSR process is an opportunity for the district to highlight accomplishments and best practices.

This MSR/SOI report is expected to be completed within the next 5-6 months. In advance, we appreciate your participation in the MSR/SOI process and look forward to working with you on this project. RECOMMENDATION:

The Board President recommends that the TEAM RCD Board of Directors review and possibly approve the employee-sharing agreement between TEAM RCD and IERCD and Task Order 2025-01.

DISCUSSION:

In September of 2022, IERCD and TEAM RCD executed an Employee-Sharing Agreement enabling funded use of IERCD employees on TEAM RCD projects. The agreement specifies mechanisms for payment, term of agreement, and status of employees contracted for TEAM RCD work, among other things. The agreement auto-renews each year in the absence of written termination and has enabled IERCD staff assistance on TEAM RCD projects including Greer Ranch and Adeline Farms.

Currently, IERCD is in possession of a \$3.5 million dollar block grant from the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA), focused on support for California Underserved and Small Producers (CUSP). The IERCD previously administered an identical grant with the exception of total funding (\$1.1 million for the previous grant), completing all required deliverables and closing out the grant successfully. As with the last grant, this new CUSP block grant requires IERCD to complete a range of actions focused on advancing awareness of CDFA funding; assisting producers with application development; and facilitating successive funding rounds where applications for assistance are reviewed, ranked, and awards provided to qualifying producers. While the grant prioritizes disadvantaged farmers, any producer able to demonstrate impacts from climate-related events including extreme weather is eligible to submit an application for addressing those impacts through direct relief payments. As with other funding focused on support of farmers, the CUSP block grant is a critical part of keeping farmland active despite the multiple economic and operational challenges to doing so.

It is important to note that as a block grant recipient, IERCD is able to transfer funds beyond its servicearea boundaries, to maximize movement of funds and benefit to a wide circle of producers. Resource conservation districts are legally allowed to contract for funding to move beyond district boundaries when it doesn't require staff member performance of core district services beyond those boundaries. Contracting with TEAM RCD will ensure TEAM RCD-area producers benefit from these funds as intended by CDFA in grant design and management.

With this updated employee-sharing agreement and task order, IERCD is seeking TEAM RCD staff assistance with advancing awareness of and engagement with the CUSP grant for producers in the TEAM RCD service area. The Task Order includes Not To Exceed total of \$15,000 and wage rates of TEAM RCD staffers planning to bill to the project, and the Employee-Sharing Agreement memorializes mutual intention and benefit from both districts in the sharing of these funds and services on behalf of this grant.

If both districts approve this agreement and Task Order, TEAM staff will be immediately eligible to begin billing time against these funds. The agreement will also enable TEAM and IERCD to continue to seek opportunities for collaboration where funding and services are exchanged for the benefit of the communities and resources served by both districts.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Not To Exceed \$15,000 for TEAM RCD employees working on the CUSP grant.

ACTION TO BE TAKEN:

The IERCD Board of Directors should approve or reject the Board President's recommendation to approve the employee-sharing agreement between TEAM RCD and IERCD and Task Order 2025-01.

PROJECT SUMMARY

IERCD is the recipient of a block grant award in the amount of three million five hundred thousand dollars and no cents (\$3,500,000) from the California Department of Food and Agriculture, focused on their California Underserved and Small Producers (CUSP) Grant. The title of this specific grant is Block Grant Program to Administer Direct Relief Grants for Extreme Weather and Other Climate Impacts, and funds are required to be used for connecting target producers to technical assistance and direct relief payments capturing impacts of extreme weather and other climate-related disasters. The focus will be in Socially Disadvantaged Farmers and Ranchers (SDFRs). Under this grant, IERCD will develop outreach materials, host workshops, and coordinate with other regional Technical Service Providers in Southern California to encourage applications by small and medium-scale farmers. IERCD will also develop application materials and administer a regional program with review periods and dissemination of direct payments to farmers every two months.

The term of this grant ends December 31st, 2026.

SCOPE OF WORK

Under this task order, IERCD seeks to secure assistance from TEAMRCD personnel in advancing CUSP grant actions within TEAM RCD's service area. In this collaboration, TEAM RCD will be a grant subcontractor, supporting this program without being required to take responsibility for specific numbers associated with work. AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE TEMECULA ELSINORE ANZA MURRIETA RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT TO THE INLAND EMPIRE RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT

THIS AGREEMENT for Personnel Sharing is entered into on _____, 2025 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the Inland Empire Resource Conservation District ("IERCD") and the Temecula Elsinore Anza Murrieta Resource Conservation District ("TEAM RCD").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, IERCD is well acquainted with, and confident in the abilities, past performance, and services provided by TEAM RCD; and

WHEREAS, IERCD believes that TEAM RCD personnel can assist in the provision of such services to IERCD at a high level of quality on terms financially acceptable to IERCD; and

WHEREAS, IERCD wishes to engage TEAM RCD for provision of its personnel to provide support for water use efficiency assessment as it relates to land management and agricultural use ("Services").

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties hereto, intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

- 1. **Contractual Relationship:** The substance of TEAM RCD's services hereunder will be that of providing personnel to IERCD to provide the Services, as well as necessary payroll and human resources functions for such assigned personnel.
- 2. Employment Status: During the term of this Agreement, TEAM RCD personnel will remain a regular employees of TEAM RCD, eligible for compensation and benefits provided to him or her as specified in the employment relationship with TEAM RCD. Employee will not be entitled to accrue or receive any compensation or employment benefits from IERCD in connection with the Services provided under this Agreement. TEAM RCD will indemnify and hold IERCD harmless from and against any employment-related claims by TEAM RCD personnel. TEAM RCD retains all right to direct its personnel, howeverIERCD may request work within the general guidelines of this Agreement directly from TEAM RCD personnel.
- 3. Assignment: During the term of this Agreement, TEAM RCD agrees to temporarily incorporate into personnel duties and work schedule the responsibility to perform the Services on behalf of IERCD in furtherance of this Agreement. Such Services may include meetings, telephone calls, site visits, direction of contractors, and direction of subordinate IERCD staff where appropriate, and preparing and making reports and presentations to IERCD's Board of Directors related to Services rendered. Services performed by TEAM RCD personnel will be performed where best suited toIERCD, most likely inIERCD facilities. Use of IERCD equipment and supplies, such as telephones, computers, and printers will be allowed in the furtherance of such Services.

- 4. **Conditions of Employment:** IERCD understands and acknowledges that it is entering into this Agreement on the basis of its familiarity and confidence in the skills and experience of TEAM RCD's services, and has not relied, in any way, on representations or promises of TEAM RCD. As a condition of TEAM RCD's agreement to provide the Services under this Agreement, IERCD agrees to indemnify and hold TEAM RCD harmless from any claims, damages or liability arising out of the provision of Services hereunder, including but not limited to claims, damages or liability to IERCD or any third party, arising out of alleged negligence.
 - a. During the term of this Agreement TEAM RCD shall be responsible for the full payment of wages to TEAM RCD personnel regardless of payment from IERCD to TEAM RCD.
 - b. TEAM RCD shall be responsible for the administration, collection, and disbursement of its personnel W-2 payroll including the calculation of gross wage entitlement, withholdings from Employee's wages and payment of those withholdings.
 - c. TEAM RCD shall be responsible for all employer tax-reporting functions as required by law, and shall have the sole right to responsibility to evaluate, reassign, discipline, or terminate the employment of its personnel. TEAM RCD shall provide prompt written notice toIERCD of any action taken which results in TEAM RCD personnel being unavailable for duty under the terms of this Agreement.
 - d. TEAM RCD and IERCD shall cooperate with one another to ensure compliance with all wage-and-hour; safety; and employment-related federal and state laws and regulations, including, but not limited to, the Family Medical Leave Act, California Family Rights Act, California Fair Employment and Housing Act, American with Disabilities Act, Fair Labor Standards Act, and Cal/OSHA or OSHA safety rules.
 - e. IERCD agrees to comply with all legally imposed safety practices and procedures with respect to TEAM RCD personnel activities. IERCD shall report all work-related accidents, injuries or illnesses to TEAM RCD within twenty-four (24) hours of any such occurrence. IERCD further agrees to: (i) provide TEAM RCD's DWC-1 form or equivalent (for purposes of workers' compensation) promptly to TEAM RCD personnel if involved in a work-related accident, injury or illness; and, (ii) facilitate receipt of emergency medical care if needed with a follow-up notification to TEAM RCD.
 - f. IERCD shall pay all invoices submitted by TEAM RCD in accordance with this Agreement within 30 days of receipt.
- 5. Changes in Employment Status: TEAM RCD shall not engage in any significant preplanned termination or lay-off that would materially affect the Services under this Agreement, nor implement any increase or reduction in pay, without first providing IERCD with thirty (30) days advance written notice. In the event of an emergency or

when TEAM RCD determines that such notice is not feasible, TEAM RCD shall provide IERCD with at least two (2) days advance written notice.

- 6. **Term:** The term of this Agreement shall commence upon the Effective Date specified above, and shall continue for one (1) year from that date. The Agreement shall thereafter automatically renew for successive one (1) year terms, unless terminated as set forth in this Agreement. Either party to this Agreement can terminate the Agreement by providing at least thirty (30) day written notice of intent to terminate. Either party may terminate this Agreement due to a breach of any provision herein by the other party, where the breach is not remedied within seven (7) days after written notice of that breach is provided to the other party in accordance with Section 8, below.
- 7. **Compensation and Billing:** IERCD agrees to compensate TEAM RCD for all the Services performed under this Agreement on a "time and materials" basis for time expended by TEAM RCD personnel, including time spent travelling to and from IERCD's offices and to worksites in connection with the Services provided to IERCD, plus mileage and expenses, including the cost of materials and supplies used in the provision of the Services under this Agreement. The rate for mileage reimbursement will be based upon Internal Revenue Service's business mile rate. Time expended by personnel will be billed on an hourly basis for actual time spent by TEAM RCD personnel in performing services to IERCD hereunder, based on wage schedule attached to this agreement.

The hourly rate is intended to cover TEAM RCD personnel's effective hourly cost of salary and benefits, the use of TEAM RCD offices and office equipment, and TEAM RCD's costs of administering this Agreement, preparing invoices and scheduling personnel time. TEAM RCD will invoice IERCD at their discretion no more frequently than a monthly basis and no less frequently than a quarterly basis, and payment will be due within thirty (30) days after the date of mailing the invoice. The invoices will detail the number of hours for each employee; mileage; and other costs incurred related to the work. Each invoice line item will be supported with back-up documentation justifying costs, consisting of employee timesheets, mileage logs, and/or receipts backing up direct costs. Payments made more than thirty (30) days from the date of the invoice will be subject to a late fee/interest charge of the lesser of (i) six percent (6%) per annum, or (ii) the maximum amount permitted under applicable law, from the thirty-first (31st) day after the date of the invoice to the date the invoice amount is paid.

8. **Notices:** All notices, invoices, reports and other communications hereunder shall be sent to the designated representative for the party to which it is directed, by U.S. Mail, overnight courier delivery, or email directed as follows:

Assignment: During the term of this Agreement, IERCD agrees to temporarily incorporate into personnel duties and work schedule the responsibility to perform the Services on behalf of TEAM RCD in furtherance of this Agreement. Such Services may include meetings, telephone calls, site visits, direction of contractors, and preparing and making reports and presentations to TEAM RCD's Board of Directors related to Services rendered. Services performed by IERCD personnel will be performed where best suited to TEAM RCD, most likely in TEAM RCD facilities. Use of TEAM RCD equipment and supplies, such as telephones, computers, and printers will be allowed in the furtherance of such Services.

- 4. **Conditions of Employment:** TEAM RCD understands and acknowledges that it is entering into this Agreement on the basis of its familiarity and confidence in the skills and experience of IERCD's services, and has not relied, in any way, on representations or promises of IERCD. As a condition of IERCD's agreement to provide the Services under this Agreement, TEAM RCD agrees to indemnify and hold IERCD harmless from any claims, damages or liability arising out of the provision of Services hereunder, including but not limited to claims, damages or liability to TEAM RCD or any third party, arising out of alleged negligence.
 - a. During the term of this Agreement IERCD shall be responsible for the full payment of wages to IERCD personnel regardless of payment from TEAM RCD to IERCD.
 - b. IERCD shall be responsible for the administration, collection, and disbursement of its personnel W-2 payroll including the calculation of gross wage entitlement, withholdings from Employee's wages and payment of those withholdings.
 - c. IERCD shall be responsible for all employer tax-reporting functions as required by law, and shall have the sole right to responsibility to evaluate, reassign, discipline, or terminate the employment of its personnel. IERCD shall provide prompt written notice to TEAM RCD of any action taken which results in IERCD personnel being unavailable for duty under the terms of this Agreement.
 - d. IERCD and TEAM RCD shall cooperate with one another to ensure compliance with all wage-and-hour; safety; and employment-related federal and state laws and regulations, including, but not limited to, the Family Medical Leave Act, California Family Rights Act, California Fair Employment and Housing Act, American with Disabilities Act, Fair Labor Standards Act, and Cal/OSHA or OSHA safety rules.
 - e. TEAM RCD agrees to comply with all legally imposed safety practices and procedures with respect to IERCD personnel activities. TEAM RCD shall report all work-related accidents, injuries or illnesses to IERCD within twenty-four (24) hours of any such occurrence. TEAM RCD further agrees to: (i) provide IERCD's DWC-1 form or equivalent (for purposes of workers' compensation) promptly to IERCD personnel if involved in a work-related accident, injury or illness; and, (ii) facilitate receipt of emergency medical care if needed with a follow-up notification to IERCD.
 - f. TEAM RCD shall pay all invoices submitted by IERCD in accordance with this Agreement within 30 days of receipt.
- 5. Changes in Employment Status: IERCD shall not engage in any significant preplanned termination or lay-off that would materially affect the Services under this Agreement, nor implement any increase or reduction in pay, without first providing TEAM RCD with thirty (30) days advance written notice. In the event of an emergency or when IERCD determines that such notice is not feasible, IERCD. shall provide TEAM RCD with at least two (2) days advance written notice.

- 6. **Term:** The term of this Agreement shall commence upon the Effective Date specified above, and shall continue for one (1) year from that date. The Agreement shall thereafter automatically renew for successive one (1) year terms, unless terminated as set forth in this Agreement. Either party to this Agreement can terminate the Agreement by providing at least thirty (30) day written notice of intent to terminate. Either party may terminate this Agreement due to a breach of any provision herein by the other party, where the breach is not remedied within seven (7) days after written notice of that breach is provided to the other party in accordance with Section 8, below.
- 7. **Compensation and Billing:** TEAM RCD agrees to compensate IERCD for all the Services performed under this Agreement on a "time and materials" basis for time expended by IERCD personnel, including time spent travelling to and from TEAM RCD's offices and to worksites in connection with the Services provided to TEAM RCD, plus mileage and expenses, including the cost of materials and supplies used in the provision of the Services under this Agreement. The rate for mileage reimbursement will be based upon Internal Revenue Service's business mile rate. Time expended by personnel will be billed on an hourly basis based on attached Rate Sheet per hour for actual time spent by IERCD personnel in performing services to TEAM RCD hereunder.

The hourly rate is intended to cover IERCD personnel's effective hourly cost of salary and benefits, the use of IERCD offices and office equipment, and IERCD's costs of administering this Agreement, preparing invoices and scheduling personnel time. IERCD will invoice TEAM RCD on a monthly basis, and payment will be due within thirty (30) days after the date of mailing the invoice. The invoices will detail the number of hours expended on a daily basis and mileage and expense charges. Payments made more than thirty (30) days from the date of the invoice will be subject to a late fee/interest charge of the lesser of (i) six percent (6%) per annum, or (ii) the maximum amount permitted under applicable law, from the thirty-first (31st) day after the date of the invoice to the date the invoiced amount is paid.

8. **Notices:** All notices, invoices, reports and other communications hereunder shall be sent to the designated representative for the party to which it is directed, by U.S. Mail, overnight courier delivery, or email directed as follows:

9. **Severability:** If any provision of this Agreement is found by any court or other legal authority, or is agreed by the parties, to be in conflict with any code or regulation

governing its subject, the conflicting provision shall be considered null and void. If the effect of nullifying any conflicting provision is such that a material benefit of the agreement to either party is lost, the Agreement may be terminated at the option of the affected party. In all other cases, the remainder of the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

- 10. **Amendment:** No amendment of this Agreement shall be valid or enforceable unless in writing and signed by both parties.
- 11. Entire Agreement: This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and there are no oral or written understandings, representations, or commitments of any kind, express or implied which are not expressly set forth herein.
- 12. No Third Party Beneficiaries: Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than IERCD and TEAM RCD.
- 13. **Counterparts:**This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts. Each shall be deemed an original and all, taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument.





Work Conducted

On December 11th 2024, an IERCD crew drove out to TEAMRCD's Greer Ranch project area to perform herbicide treatments and to conduct quarterly monitoring tasks throughout the various CE's.

The IERCD crew began its efforts within CE9, this particular basin had over 700 invasive tamarisk, most of which were immature. The crew got through half of the tamarisk in this basin and it will require additional treatments in 2025. All immature tamarisk were treated using a cut stump application method, utilizing Habitat @ 20% (due to standing water in basin). All mature and large tamarisk received a basal bark application with the herbicide Pathfinder @ 100% (all these individuals were not in standing water). Fortunately, even though there are a large amount of tamarisk remaining in this basin, they will not reach maturity for several more years, giving the IERCD crew time to manage them before they flower and seed. The team made sure to knock out these "mature" tamarisk, since these are the trees that are continuing to disperse seed into CE9.

Next the IERCD crew relocated to CE10, to tackle some invasive species removal efforts within this basin. Much like CE9 invasive tamarisk had also infiltrated this parcel, in addition invasive pampas grass and fountain grass were also present in this easement. All tamarisk within this parcel were treated using the same methods as the previous parcel. About 35 tamarisk were treated, 5 being mature/seed producing individuals. Another, Cal-IPC Rated: High, plant known as pampas grass was also present in this parcel and was also treated. All pampas grass treatments were conducted via a foliar application with Roundup Custom @ 2%. About 80% of the pampas grass individuals were "mature" and flowering, so follow up treatments will likely be needed in 2025. While treating the pampas grass, the irrigation on the slope, had been active recently, as evidenced by moisture directly down-slope of all sprinkler heads and non-native germination occurring in these moist areas (see "Prohibited Use" section).

While invasive species removal efforts were occurring, a Field Ecologist drove to all other "Conservation Easements" to check on general conditions. During the easement checks, a trash bag was filled with various minor trash items that had accumulated in CE3, CE5, and CE12. All trash was disposed of offsite.

All "Invasive Species Removals" were mapped in Touch GIS and a map of treatment location will be included in the next annual report.

Notable Plant Phenology

- Salt cedar (*Tamarisk ramosissima*); Cal-IPC Rating: High: Leafed out (85%), Green/in flower (15%).
- Pampas Grass (*Cortaderia selloana*); Cal-IPC Rating: High, Green/Immature (10%), Green/in flower (90%)
- Fountain Grass (*Pennisetum setaceum*); Cal-IPC Rating: Moderate, Green/Immature (80%), Green/in flower (20%)

Bird Nesting Avoidance Measures

Site visits were made outside of the nesting season.

Quantitative Measures

- Salt cedar (*Tamarisk ramosissima*): 375 individuals treated.
- Pampas Grass (Cortaderia selloana): 75 individuals treated.
- 1 trash bag filled with miscellaneous minor trash found in parcels.
- 1 "Prohibited Uses" observed.

Notable Observation/Events

- Prohibited Use: "(a) Nuisance Water, such as...supplemental watering..."
 - Supplemental watering is occurring inside of CE10. (see "Map" for exact location)
 - Supplemental watering is coming directly from an irrigation system on the slope with invasive Pampas grass.
 - Supplemental watering is giving invasive plants a competitive advantage on the slope.
 - Non-native plant germination was observed directly below the sprinkler heads.
 - Recommendation: Greer Ranch HOA will need to turn off this portion of the irrigation to prevent any further negative impacts to the easement.

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Map: The irrigation that is still running is located on the slope of CE10 (yellow pin). Greer Ranch HOA will need to ensure that this portion of the irrigation is turn off, to stop further negative impacts to the easement.

BACKGROUND: Summary

Properties for which taxes are not redeemed are auctioned to collect back taxes. After property has been tax-defaulted for a period of five or more years from the original tax-default year, it becomes subject to the Treasurer-Tax Collector's "Notice of Power to Sell Tax Defaulted Property," which is then recorded.

If the property is not subsequently redeemed by the payment of all amounts due, it is offered for sale by the Treasurer-Tax Collector. This action will set in motion the Treasurer-Tax Collector's late April sale.

SUMMARY OF THE April 24, 2025, through April 29, 2025, Internet Tax Sale conducted via Internet through Bid4Assets, Inc.

The Treasurer-Tax Collector proposes to offer a maximum of four hundred forty-three (443) "fee parcels":

On April 24, 2025, at 8:00 AM through April 25, 2025, at 9:00 AM

- a) Four hundred twenty-nine (429) fee parcels will be offered for a minimum bid of full redemption, plus the cost of sale.
- Fourteen (14) fee parcels will be offered for a minimum bid of cost of sale only.

The aggregate minimum bid for all parcels listed in Exhibit "A" is \$9,217,518.

<u>On April 25, 2025, at 9:00 AM through April 29, 2025,</u> four hundred twenty-nine (429) of the four hundred twenty-nine (429) fee parcels offered for a minimum bid of full redemption plus the cost of sale between April 24, 2025, at 8:00 AM and April 25, 2025, at 9:00 AM, that do not receive bids will be re-offered at a reduced minimum bid for the following reduced amounts:

- a) Two hundred fifty-three (253) or fewer fee parcels will be offered for a minimum bid of cost of sale only.
- b) One hundred seventy-six (176) or fewer fee parcels will be offered at a minimum bid of taxes only, plus cost of sale.

In general, the financial impact of tax sales can be summarized as follows:

- Sales at, or above, the amount of taxes owed have no direct negative impact on the County's budget.
- For this sale, if all parcels being reoffered for cost of sale were to sell for only the minimum bid, the maximum tax loss would be \$2,238,319. Considering the Teeter formula, which shares this loss with other taxing entities, the maximum loss of the Tax Losses Reserve Fund would be \$1,382,136. Parcels reoffered for taxes only, plus cost of sale will not realize a tax loss.
- Accordingly, there should be no direct impact on the County General Fund because reserves exceeding the amount have been set aside.
- There will likely be minimal impact upon the Tax Losses Reserve Fund itself. Based upon recent experience, this sale is not expected to realize the maximum loss for three reasons: (1) properties are inevitably pulled from the sale due to various reasons including taxpayer redemptions; (2) some parcels will sell for more than the minimum bid; and (3) other parcels are likely to receive no bids. For example, in previous tax sales, the maximum loss to the Tax Losses Reserve Fund for 2022-2023 was \$787,089; however, the realized loss was \$38,444 only 5% of the maximum loss. Similarly, the maximum loss of the Tax Losses Reserve Fund for 2023-2024 was \$359,543; however, the realized loss was \$15,143 - only 4% of the maximum loss.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The purpose of offering tax-defaulted properties is to collect unpaid taxes and return the property to a revenue-generating status by conveying the property to another owner or motivating the assessee to redeem.

- The Northwest Mosquito & Vector Control District intends to make public health pesticide applications to, over and adjacent to constructed conveyances, surface waters and other waters of the U.S. owned and controlled by an entity other that the District for vector control purposes per the requirements of the General NP DES Permit for Biological and Residual Discharges for Vector Control Applications.
- The District's activities are conducted year-round within a 300-mile areas situated in the western portion of the County of Riverside. The areas that will actually or potentially impacted by District activities include the following: the incorporated cities of Calimesa, Canyon Lake, Corona, Lake Elsinore, Eastvale, Jurupa Valley, Norco and Riverside. The District also controls vectors in the northwest portion of Riverside County including the following areas of Coronita, El Cerrito, Glen Avon, Highgrove, Home Gardens, Woodcrest and other unincorporated areas within the boundaries of the Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District. Additionally, the District may be requested to provide vector control in the sphere of influence area (presently vector control is provided by the County). In addition to the above mentioned the District at times may implement vector control methods in areas adjacent to the District jurisdiction pursuant the California Health and Safety Code.
- The NPDES Permit requirements for listing of the Public Health Pesticides anticipated to be used were modified from the previous permit, to the new permit, issued in 2016. The newer requirements specify that any pesticide product can be used that contains approved active ingredients, provided all pesticide label restrictions and instructions are followed. In addition, the minimum risk pesticides have been exempted from the FIFRA requirements. The following tables list the active ingredients approved for the FIFRA regulated pesticides.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

Properties for which taxes are not redeemed are sold to collect back taxes. After property has been tax-defaulted for a period of five or more years from the original tax-default year, it becomes subject to the Treasurer-Tax Collector's "Notice of Power to Sell Tax Defaulted Property," which is then recorded. When parcels which are rendered unusable by their size, location, or other conditions are subject to sale for nonpayment of taxes, the Treasurer-Tax collector may offer these parcels at a reduced minimum bid only to owners of contiguous parcels, pursuant to Revenue and Taxation Code 3692(c).

If the property is not subsequently redeemed by the payment of all amounts due, it is offered for sale by the Treasurer-Tax Collector. This action will set in motion the Treasurer-Tax Collector's late April Sealed Bid sale.

The Treasurer-Tax Collector proposes to offer a maximum of thirty-seven (37) "fee parcels":

a) Thirty-seven (37) fee parcels will be offered for a reduced minimum bid.

- For this sale, if all parcels being reoffered for cost of sale were to sell for only the minimum bid, the maximum tax loss would be \$192,817. Considering the Teeter formula, which shares this loss with other taxing entities, the maximum loss of the Tax Losses Reserve Fund would be \$127,782.
- Accordingly, there should be no direct impact on the County General Fund because reserves exceeding the amount have been set aside.
- There will likely be minimal impact upon the Tax Losses Reserve Fund itself. Based upon recent experience, this sale is not expected to realize the maximum loss for three reasons: (1) properties are inevitably pulled from the sale due to various reasons including taxpayer redemptions; (2) some parcels will sell for more than the minimum bid; and (3) other parcels are likely to receive no bids.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The purpose of offering tax-defaulted properties is to collect unpaid taxes and return the property to a revenue-generating status by conveying the property to another owner or motivating the assessee to redeem.



Notice of Intent to Apply Public Health Pesticides for Vector Control Purposes to Surface Waters and Waters of the U.S. Within Western Riverside County.

- The Northwest Mosquito & Vector Control District intends to make public health pesticide applications to, over and adjacent to constructed conveyances, surface waters and other waters of the U.S. owned and controlled by an entity other that the District for vector control purposes per the requirements of the General NP DES Permit for Biological and Residual Discharges for Vector Control Applications.
- The District's activities are conducted year-round within a 300-mile areas situated in the western portion of the County of Riverside. The areas that will actually or potentially impacted by District activities include the following: the incorporated cities of Calimesa, Canyon Lake, Corona, Lake Elsinore, Eastvale, Jurupa Valley, Norco and Riverside. The District also controls vectors in the northwest portion of Riverside County including the following areas of Coronita, El Cerrito, Glen Avon, Highgrove, Home Gardens, Woodcrest and other unincorporated areas within the boundaries of the Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District. Additionally, the District may be requested to provide vector control in the sphere of influence area (presently vector control is provided by the County). In addition to the above mentioned the District at times may implement vector control methods in areas adjacent to the District jurisdiction pursuant the California Health and Safety Code.
- The NPDES Permit requirements for listing of the Public Health Pesticides anticipated to be used were modified from the previous permit, to the new permit, issued in 2016. The newer requirements specify that any pesticide product can be used that contains approved active ingredients, provided all pesticide label restrictions and instructions are followed. In addition, the minimum risk pesticides have been exempted from the FIFRA requirements. The following tables list the active ingredients approved for the FIFRA regulated pesticides.
